Celebrating it's 17th year, the Ice Festival hosts one of the largest ice carving events in the area. Shipshewana businesses provide space in front of their stores for Ice Carvers to drill and shave blocks of ice into artful masterpieces. Sponsors purchase these large blocks of Street. ice to be carved, sometimes submitting a design for the carver to create with Ice Festival Pin. This year, Shelby the ice block and other times allowing the carver free reign over their creation.

It is an amazing spectacle to see. Take a walk around town to check out the wonders the carvers are creating. The sponsored blocks will be carved all day on Friday, leading up to the Wing Sauce Competition from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. that night. Some stores in the 7 p.m. as well.

On Saturday, the remaining ice blocks will be carved, with competition ice carvings occurring on the south November 8. side of the Davis Mercantile at 11 a.m.

The annual Chili Cook-off will also be happening Saturday morning, starting at 11 a.m. until sold out. Both the Wing Sauce Competition and the Chili Cook-Off will take place at the Smokehouse Grill & Supply store located on Morton

Don't forget to purchase your Mullet placed first in the pin design contest. Second place was awarded to Thomas Bryan and third place to Katie Bontrager. Pins are \$20 each and gets you numerous deals throughout Shipshewana for two whole months, plus free entry to both the wing sauce competition and the chili cook-off.
